
For each 2-page short communication, at least one author **must** pay congress fees before **31 May 2009**, otherwise the communication will not be included in the proceedings. One paying author may present more than one communication. Congress fees will be published on the Nitrogen workshop web page: http://www.nitrogenworkshop2009.org by **31 October 2008**.

Deadlines and other important dates

- 31 October 2008: congress fees will be published on registration page; the third announcement will be sent.
- 30 November 2008: deadline for the submission of 250-word abstracts.
- 31 December 2008: notification of acceptance of the abstracts.
- 28 February 2009: deadline for the submission of 2-page camera-ready short communications. At this stage, you may indicate whether you propose an oral or a poster presentation.
- **15 April 2009**: publication of the list of accepted short communications, with final indication of the workshop sessions and oral or poster assignment.
- 30 April 2009: publication of the final programme; deadline for paying congress fees at reduced rate.
- 31 May 2009: deadline for paying congress fees at full rate.

Papers without at least one paying author will not be published in the proceedings.

The Workshop is jointly organised by the Department of Crop Science of the University of Milan and by the Department of Agronomy, Forest and Land Management of the University of Turin.

Presentation of the workshop

The Nitrogen workshop is a biennial international scientific meeting aimed at exchanging ideas and views on the state of the art of research on N use in agriculture. Different points of view are considered (agronomists, soil scientists, microbiologists, crop physiologists, modellers, etc.).

Previous editions of Nitrogen workshop were held since 1982 in various European countries (United Kingdom, Belgium, Germay, Denmark, France, The Netherlands and Spain). For the first time, in 2008 the Nitrogen workshop will be held in Italy. We will appreciate contributions from a large range of experts, with a particular emphasis on the integration of different scales and disciplines.
